SERMON SUMMARIES

1ST SERVICE: GOSPEL TO THE POOR (Part 1)

Anchor Scripture: Luke 4:14-20

Power and Consistency

When power is available, you don't need to advertise yourself—power advertises you. When you get breakthroughs, return to God. Be consistent in church because you don't know your day of visitation. Luke 4:18 says that everyone has something written about them. Until you find out what it is, you will struggle.

Redeemed from Poverty

Poverty is one of the curses of the law. The Gospel (good news) is that Christ redeemed us from the curse so Abraham's blessing may rest on us (Galatians 3:13-14). Abraham was very rich in livestock, silver, and gold (Genesis 13:2), never sick, and blessed in all things (Genesis 24:1). If we're children of Abraham, this is our heritage.

The poor in spirit come to God hungry, not full. Matthew 5:3 says, When you come hungry, God fills you. If you're not poor in spirit, you can't receive from Jesus or what the Pastor preaches.

Value Information

If you want to be rich, never ignore information. The good news is information about what God has done in Christ. Those who end up poor despise information.

Save at least 20% on everything that comes in. What you do in seasons of plenty determines if you'll go up in

Poverty is a spirit, mindset, and condition. Poor people don't value information. Not to be informed is to be deformed. How you receive information and what you do with it matters. Jesus said, Take heed what you hear (Mark 4:24) and how you hear (Luke 8:18).

Gifts Must Become Skills

Nobody pays you for your gift—people pay you for your skill. Develop your gift into a skill people are willing to pay for. Joseph appeared before Pharaoh not as a dreamer but as an interpreter of dreams. Never ignore any opportunity—there are no little opportunities. The consistent person will abound with blessings (Proverbs 28:20).

Give God Evidence

Many are poor because they hoard their gifts. You don't contribute, tithe, or volunteer—you have nothing to bring before God. Give God evidence. When Dorcas died, people called Peter because she had evidence of what she'd done (Acts 9:36-40).

The Gospel gives us the Blessing, and the Blessing produces riches. You can't see the blessing, but it's working. When a blessed man enters a place, things turn around. The Blessing makes rich and adds no sorrow (Proverbs 10:22). When we believe the Gospel and do something with it, our mindsets change, and we experience blessings.

2ND SERVICE: GOSPEL TO THE POOR (2)

God's Will for Provision

Being poor is a choice if you're born again. Rich means having a full supply of everything you need. God can make every blessing come in abundance so you always have sufficiency in everything (2 Corinthians 9:8). God wants you to have enough to bless others. You must settle that God wants to meet all your needs (Philippians 4:19).

Riches and Wealth

If the only thing you aspire to have is money, you're poor because money has limitations (Proverbs 23:4-5). Righteous people have both riches (tangible—money) and wealth (intangible—things that make riches work).

If you have riches only, they'll go. If you have wealth and riches, riches multiply. If you have only wealth, riches will come. Wealth produces riches any day, any time, in any country.

Psalm 112:1-2 teaches that when you fear the Lord and delight in His commands, you're blessed. Greed is idolatry—those who flaunt possessions on social media are poor. Empty vessels make noise. A man's life doesn't consist of what he has (Luke 12:13-21).

Being Rich Towards God The first characteristic of wealth is being rich towards God, knowing God and His ways. Anyone who knows God is wealthy. God is interested in you and your generation being rich (Psalm 112:1). Being rich towards God means knowing Him and His ways (Jeremiah 9:23-24).

Jacob multiplied everything in Laban's house because wealth was inside him. When you know God, you'll fear Him and won't steal. If you don't have riches, get wealth first. If you get riches first, they'll fly away.

Knowing God is the greatest thing anyone can possess (2 Kings 20:1-6). Solomon was wealthy before he became rich. God calls anyone not rich towards Him a fool. Wealth is knowing God and what turns His heart towards you.

There are things riches can't deliver you from, but knowing God will turn your situation around. God can add years to your life.

When you know God's ways, it's a defence. What you receive in church messages every Sunday is wealth. When you're wealthy, God teaches you things others don't know.

God teaches you not to steal because every stealing is a curse (Zechariah 5:4). Wealth is knowing God, knowing His ways, and following them. If you do this, you'll become a

MIDWEEK SERVICE: THOSE THAT WILL BE RICH

God deals with information. To be without information is to be deformed.

4 Characteristics of Those Who Will Be Rich:

- Rich Towards God (Psalm 112:1-3): Know God and His ways—this is wealth that attracts, protects, and increases riches (Jeremiah 9:24, 1 Chronicles 28:9). Your personal knowledge of God is wealth. There are different levels of being rich: those whose needs are provided, those entrusted with riches, and those who are channels of blessing.
- Don't Love Money: The love of money is the root of all evil. You can't serve God and money. If all your life is making money, you're serving money, not God. God is the source of every good thing—don't make the channel your source (James 1:17). Don't let money make you compromise, sell your soul, or shift your morals. God supplies all needs according to His riches in glory (Philippians 4:19). Make His kingdom and righteousness your priority (Matthew 6:33).
- Have Self-Control (Proverbs 25:28): Someone without self-control is like a city without walls. Money makes you feel invincible—lack of self-control destroyed Solomon (Ecclesiastes 2:9-10). Practice delayed gratification and fasting, Just because you can afford something doesn't mean you should own it (1 Corinthians 9:27). Let self-control be your chromoter asset. control be your strongest asset.
- Not Haughty or Arrogant (1 Timothy 6:17-19): When you're rich, it's God who gave it to you. Don't trust in uncertain riches or become proud. Daniel 4:2-3, 28-33 shows what happens when arrogance prevails. Don't use your money to support or sponsor evil. God wants you to be comfortable serving Him better, not to abandon Him. Whatever robs your time with God or diminishes your commitment is not of God.


