SERMON SUMMARY: FRAMING YOUR WORLD

Faith is not about denying reality; it is about recognizing reality while refusing to let negativity dictate the course of your life. It is our responsibility to shape our worlds.

Words possess immense power, and it is through words that we frame our reality (Proverbs 18:20-21). However, spoken words must originate from a place of meditation. To effectively frame our world with our words, we must first frame our thoughts with the

Our thoughts reflect who we are (Proverbs 23:7), and from the abundance of our hearts, our mouths will speak (Matthew 12:34). God gifted us with the ability to speak not only for communication but also for creation (John 1:1-3). This process begins with our thoughts. Anything that shapes our thoughts ultimately shapes our lives.

The words we speak determine what we produce (Proverbs 13:2). Whatever we constantly think about is what we will consistently produce (Deuteronomy 6:6-8, 11:18-21).

We can find everything we seek in the Word of God. When we prayerfully seek God's Word, He sends His light through revelation, leading to material manifestation (James 1:17).

Revelation is not merely for gaining knowledge but for producing tangible results. However, these results will only materialize when we put the revelation into action (James 2:18). Our lives will attract the material equivalent of our most dominant thoughts.

For our words to be powerful, they must align with our thoughts (Proverbs 23:7). So, how do we make the Word of God our most dominant thought and the most dominant thing we speak? Psalm 19:14. God commands us to lay up His Word in our hearts (Deuteronomy 6:6, 11:8). We accomplish this by following the guidance in Joshua 1:8.

Meditation involves holding internal conversations and brooding over something. Just as eating is essential for physical growth, food digestion truly allows us to grow; meditation can be likened to the digestion of spiritual food. It is through pondering and brooding over the Word of God that we experience spiritual growth.

We are instructed to meditate on God's Word day and night (Joshua 1:8). Vigils can involve more than prayer; they can also involve reading and meditating on God's Word.

Just as improperly cooked food can be challenging to digest, it is possible not to absorb God's Word fully.

This is why Pastors must be well-prepared and study God's Word to provide their flock with the right spiritual nourishment.

In agriculture, a cow that does not chew the cud may not produce enough milk and could be sick. Similarly, if we do not revisit and meditate on God's Word, we will not produce the fruits of righteousness, and it may indicate spiritual unsoundness (1 Timothy 4:15).

Two notable examples of meditation in the Bible

- 1. Isaac: Isaac was meditating in the fields when his wife, Rebecca, was brought to him (Genesis 24:63-67).
- 2. Joshua: Before the children of Israel crossed the River Jordan after Moses' death, Joshua separated himself to meditate. (Joshua 5:13-15).

Our lives will follow the trajectory of our most dominant thoughts. Thus, if we ponder good things and confess what we ponder, then we will have good things (Mark 11:23, Philippians 4:8).



In the next few weeks, I will give proven Biblical principles that guide and guard choosing of a wife or husband. A good marriage starts with choosing well. If you correctly answer these questions which underline these principles, you would have already made huge leap into a happily-ever-after.

Principle 1 - Christ

The first question (which is the foundation) is this: is your intending in Christ? Is he or she born again? If he or she is not, you have broken the first principle. You will be unequally yoked. (2 Corinthians 6:14). If you are a believer, the word of God commands you to marry a believer. You neglect this command at your peril and pain.

The head or spiritual authority of any unbeliever is the devil - he rules over everyone who is not saved (Ephesians 2:2). The devil will use that unsaved intending to frustrate you. Be sure of this. You should also know that you don't marry them to save them. You are not the Messiah. If they are not saved before wedding, there is no guarantee they will be saved after it.

If you ignore this command, you will endure marriage instead of enjoying it. It does not matter how long it takes, God's word cannot fail. Don't allow passion or pressure blind you. Stick to what the word of God says. It is the only safe and sure ground.

This life is already tough. Don't make it tougher for yourself. In Christ or in crisis, you choose.
