# **SERMON SUMMARIES**

#### 1ST SERVICE: ORACLES OF WEALTH (Part 1)

An Oracle is the speaking or saying of God or speaking on behalf of God. In 1 Peter 4:11, the Bible says that anyone who is speaking should speak as an oracle of God: "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God" (1 Peter 4:11).

Jesus said you can't serve God and Mammon (Matthew 6:24). When man sinned, God lost man and the earth. To get them back, He sowed a seed, Jesus.

The basis for our prosperity as believers is what Christ has done for us. In Galatians 3:13-14, we see that Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law, which are: Poverty, Sickness and Separation from God. In 2 Corinthians 8:9, the Bible says that Christ was made poor so we might be rich. So it pleases God when we prosper.

As long as the earth exists, seed time and harvest must remain. God subjected Himself to this law by sowing His seed, Jesus. We see this in John 3:16.

In the kingdom, we must obey the law of sowing if we want to see and experience prosperity. We give our offerings and tithes, and the highest level is entering into partnership with God, which entails giving Him everything we have whenever He calls for it.

However, we must not go into any stage until we have a revelation of it. This means we shouldn't start tithing or enter the partnership stage until it's a revelation; we understand the essence.

Jesus told the Pharisees in Matthew 23:23 that they tithe everything but forget the weightier matters of the law: justice, mercy, and faith.

There's something weightier in God's sight than offerings and tithes. It's doing justly towards men. This means not cheating people. Many businesspeople cheat clients and customers for personal gain, but God detests this.

In Proverbs 11:1, it shows that God detests unjust scales: "A false balance is an abomination to the Lord, but a just weight is his delight." He doesn't want us to be cheats and then try to give Him offerings or tithes from what we've cheated people of. God doesn't endorse this at all.

The Bible says that the foundation of God's throne is justice and mercy. So doing what is right and fair is far more important to God than anything we might bring as an offering to Him.

#### 2ND SERVICE: ORACLES OF WEALTH (2)

When we are born again, we are born into God's kingdom, and some principles guide its citizens. One of such principles is the principle of sowing.

There are three kinds of seeds we have to sow. They are:

- 1. The Word (Luke 8:11)
- 2. Our actions (Galatians 6:9)
- 3. Money

Prayer is like the rain that pours from heaven to wet the ground. The Word is like the seed. Whenever we pray without seed, it's like pouring rain on an empty soil. So, we must have seed before we pray.

Our actions are also seeds that we sow daily. As we look into God's Word and obey His instructions to us daily, we are sowing seeds of good works. In due season, we'll reap a bountiful harvest for as long as we remain faithful.

Another principle that kingdom citizens are expected to live by is not being wasteful. When Jesus fed the five thousand, after they had eaten, He told His disciples to gather the remnant so that there would be no waste (John 6:12).

He did this because God hates waste. God expects us to utilise every resource He blesses us with efficiently. Even when we have in abundance, we must never be wasteful.

We must also bear in mind that God doesn't want us to despise little beginnings (Zechariah 4:10): "For who has despised the day of small things?" Often, when God wants to begin something, He starts small. It's just like the creation of the human race.

He started with just creating Adam and Eve. Also, Jesus said a parable about the mustard tree (Matthew 13:31-32). Though it has one of the smallest seeds, it grows into a big plant. So, we must never despise little, humble beginnings. But we must not remain small.

Just as God did with the children of Israel in the wilderness, God will do with us. God will not entrust anything into our hands until we can fully trust Him.

He gave the children of Israel manna daily so they could learn to trust Him for their daily provision (Exodus 16:4). He also told Moses how they were to take the manna daily; they were to take enough for each day and no more except for the day before the sabbath (Exodus 16:16-30). God wanted them to learn to trust Him for their supplies, and He wants us to do the same.

#### MIDWEEK SERVICE: HABITS OF THE PROSPEROUS

We have established that God desires our prosperity; it's His will (Galatians 3:13-14, 2 Corinthians 8:9).

However, if we don't have the habits of prosperous people, we might not see this manifestation of God's will in our lives. Habits are things we do subconsciously. They are a system of behaviour.

What are these habits prosperous people have?

Prosperous people ensure their souls prosper. In 3 John 2, the Bible shows us that we are to prosper and be in health, even as our souls prosper. This signifies how important it is for the soul to prosper. The soul is the seat of our minds, will, and emotions. The only way we can make it prosper is by continually feeding it the Word of God.

The prosperous meditate on God's Word: In Joshua 19. God, told Joshua to meditate on His Word.

The prosperous meditate on God's Word: In Joshua 1:8, God told Joshua to meditate on His Word because it would help him be careful to obey it, and when he did, he would prosper and have good success. Without meditation, we might not remember what God has instructed us to do, and when we don't do it, we won't prosper. It is our responsibility to make ourselves prosper. God has already given us everything to prosper.

Prosperous people obey the laws of wealth: The first law of wealth is that you don't spend everything you earn; you keep some for a rainy day.

• The second law of wealth is that you don't get it hastily; true wealth takes time to acquire. Trying to be rich through get-rich-quick schemes has destroyed many people. In Proverbs 28:20, the Bible says that a faithful man will abound in many blessings, but warns against hastiness. Also, in Proverbs 20:21, it teaches that until we are faithful in another man's business, God will not give us our own. The third law of wealth is that we must mind our association. Although King Jehoshaphat loved the Lord, he did not keep the right company. He married into the house of Ahab (2 Chronicles 18:1), who happened to be one of the most wicked kings of Israel, and went into business partnership with Amaziah, another wicked king of Israel. Because of this, he introduced trouble into his lineage, and his business with Amaziah did not prosper (2 Chronicles 19:1-2).


He was also thrown into the lions' den but came out alive because he defied the order of the king concerning prayer and worship to God. (Daniel 6:1-28).
