### **SERMON SUMMARIES**

1ST SERVICE: WHERE THE WORD OF A KING IS (Part 1)

### Anchor Scripture: Ecclesiastes 8:4

In the spiritual realm, Christ has made us kings and priests unto God (Revelation 1:5-6). A king holds authority and rules through his words. Words are not merely for communication; their primary purpose is to exercise

When God desires to transform our lives, He begins by reprogramming our speech (Proverbs 12:14; 13:2; 18:20-21). The spirit within a person is revealed by what they say (Matthew 12:34-37; Proverbs 6:2).

Our words indicate our maturity (James 3:2; Psalm 15:1-4), for a mature person makes commitments and does not retract them (Psalm 15:4).

As children of God, we are seen as kings and are expected to live accordingly. By continually speaking God's Word, we walk in favour and are filled with His blessings.

Those who first receive deliverance in God's kingdom are those who speak His Word faithfully (Matthew 4:14-16; John 1:1-3). There are no ordinary words—angels respond to the Word of God, and when we declare it, we activate angelic ministry (Psalm 103:20).

No one attains glory outside the righteousness that comes through Christ. Like ascending steps on a ladder, we must grow higher in Him to gain greater spiritual power. We grow by feeding on God's Word (1 Peter 2:2).

Once we are in Christ, it is no longer we who work in our lives but God (Ezekiel 36:26). It is God who works in us to will and to act according to His good purpose (Philippians 2:13). As we yield to the Word we receive, the Spirit empowers us to live it out. By doing so, we mature and grow in the Spirit.

2ND SERVICE: WHERE THE WORD OF A KING IS (2)

God reprograms our lives from the inside out, beginning God transforms lives by renewing the mind through faith with our faith and words. Spiritual growth and dominion and words. Until our thinking aligns with His Word, we come through and practising cannot live out our new identity in Christ. the Word of God.

direction requires planning and consistency Key Points: (Proverbs 16:9). Maturity means doing what we should, not only what we like. God changes us internally before results show externally.

We enter God's promises through the ministry of teaching. You grow by understanding the Word before praying it (1 Peter 2:2, Hebrews 11:3). The Word transforms you first, then your circumstances.

God created the world with His Word (Genesis 1). You are made in His image, so you also shape your world by what you say. Speak what you want to see, not what you see.

Adam lost his position of authority, but Jesus restored it through righteousness (Romans 5:12, Genesis 28:12, John 1:47-51). True dominion comes by growing in Christ through His Word, not by human effort.

Growth happens when you practice what you are taught. The Word feeds your spirit, strengthens your words, and builds spiritual authority. You cannot outsource spiritual growth; you must yield to God's Word personally.

Words reflect the heart. God changes lives by changing hearts (Ezekiel 36:26–27). As you yield, the Holy Spirit empowers you to do the Word (Philippians 2:13). Keep your heart full of God's Word, and you'll grow strong in

Let God's Word dwell richly in you. Practice what you learn, speak faith-filled words, and act promptly on divine instructions. Growth, power, and dominion come through a heart fully yielded to God's Word.

MIDWEEK SERVICE: CASTING DOWN IMAGINATIONS

- 1.At Salvation, we receive God's nature, are moved from darkness into Christ's Kingdom, and must renew our minds through His Word (Romans 12:2).
- 2. The Mind Determines Victory: Without a renewed mind, believers remain bound. True change starts when our thinking reflects God's truth.

  3. How Satan Gains Control
- - \*\*Strongholds: Wrong beliefs.
  - \*\*Imaginations: False mental pictures.
    \*\*High Things: Prideful thoughts.
  - \*\*These must be cast down through the Word of God
  - (2 Corinthians 10:4-5).
- 4. Words Shape Reality: Faith words bring victory; fear words bring defeat. Like David, speak what you believe, not what you see (1 Samuel 17).

### Final Charge:

Your mind follows what you feed it. Fill it with God's Word, reject fear, and your life will align with the image formed by faith.

### **DAILY DEVOTIONAL**

The fire will go out where there is no wood. Wood represents the Word of God, and fire symbolises prayer. Without the steady supply of the Word of God, your prayer life will soon crackle and fizzle out.

Don't ever allow this to happen. To keep the fire at the altar of your prayer life burning, you must seek the Word of God more than your necessary food. (Job 23:12).

This is important because as long as the fire of your prayer life is burning, flies and beasts dare not come near you. The devil is described as "a roaring lion walking about, seeking whom he may devour" (1 Peter 5:8), and the Lord Jesus also called him Beelzebub, which means the lord of the fly. (Luke 11:18-19).



Word: What the devil cannot devour, he seeks to defile. But as long as the fire is on and logs of wood are constantly fed to it, (lies dare not come near the pot of blessing, nor can the roaring beast venture near the campfire.

<u>Prayer:</u> Father, please give me a new thirst and hunger for your Word in Jesus' name. Amen.

### **A Kingdom Mindset for Business**

"Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labour in vain." - Psalm 127:1.

This article explores how to establish a startup that embodies biblical principles while achieving sustainable success.

Genesis 1:28 gives us the "Dominion Mandate," a call for humanity to be fruitful, multiply, and subdue the earth. This isn't a call to exploitation but to creative stewardship. ### **Key Biblical Foundations:**

### **Biblical Principles for Christian Entrepreneurs**

### 1. Begin with God's Guidance:

Seek Wisdom: James 1:5 says, "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you." Before registering your business or choosing your services, ask God for wisdom and clarity. Ask for wisdom not only on the "what" and "how" of your business but also on the "why." What is your divine purpose in this venture? Seek His will, not only your ambitions.

Trust in His Direction: Before launching into business planning, take time to pray and seek God's direction. Proverbs 16:3 is a foundational scripture for every entrepreneur: "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." This doesn't mean you don't need a plan; it means you trust that God will direct your steps as you work diligently.

• James 1:5: "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault."

### Ask yourself:

- Is this business idea aligned with God's will for my life?
- How can this venture serve others and bring glory to God?
- What are my true motivations—service or selfish gain?

### **Practical Application:**

- Begin each day with prayer for wisdom and guidance.
- Regularly fast and pray about major business decisions.
- Seek counsel from mature Christian mentors and advisors
- "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." -Proverbs 16:3.

### 2. Practice Unwavering Integrity:

Integrity forms the foundation of any Christian business. This means being honest in all dealings, keeping promises, and maintaining the same standards whether anyone is watching or not.

The Pursuit of Righteousness: In the marketplace, it can be tempting to cut corners for the sake of profit. However, Jesus tells us in Matthew 6:33 to seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." This means prioritising ethical conduct, honesty, and integrity above all else. A business built on dishonest scales is a business that will not stand in the long run (Proverbs 11:1).

Shortcuts or deceit may bring quick gains, but they destroy long-term credibility.

- Proverbs 11:1: "The Lord detests dishonest scales, but accurate weights find favour with him.
- Colossians 3:23: "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord."

### **Guidelines for Business Integrity:**

- Be truthful in marketing and sales.
- Be transparent about your products, services, and pricing.
- Honour contracts and agreements fully (Deliver what you promise).
- Admit mistakes quickly and make things right.
- Treat employees, customers, suppliers, and competitors fairly.
- Pay taxes honestly and on time.
- Avoid deceptive marketing or sales tactics.

"Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but whoever takes crooked paths will be found out." - Proverbs 10:9.

### 3. Embrace Servant Leadership:

Christian entrepreneurs are called to lead as servants, putting others' needs before their own while maintaining strong leadership. Business is not only about making money; it's about solving problems and serving people. Serve, Don't Exploit.
