SERMON SUMMARIES

1ST SERVICE: - BUILDING ON A NEW FOUNDATION

The Bible asks, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" (Psalm 11:3). We've learned that our actions-even those taken while single-can have lasting effects, reaching our children and even our children's children, up to the fourth generation.

Sometimes, the mistakes of our ancestors cause suffering for later generations. Even righteous people can experience the consequences of these past errors if they don't take action. But thank God, Jesus has given us a new way forward. Through Christ, God offers us the chance to build on a new, solid foundation—Jesus Himself (Ephesians 1:3).

Proverbs 26:2 says, "Like a fluttering sparrow or a darting swallow, an undeserved curse does not come to rest." In other words, a curse can only take effect if it has a legal right to do so. To break these generational curses, we apply the blood of Jesus to those areas in our lives, removing any legal grounds for the curse to remain.

Nothing happens by chance in this world. Life is deeply spiritual, and as believers, we have the authority, power, and permission to bring about change. We can enforce our victory through what Christ has accomplished for us.

To build a strong, godly foundation, there are ten spiritual laws we must follow:

The Law of No Return: We must not return to the sins that opened the door to curses in our lives. True repentance means leaving the past behind. (John 5:1-14: 2 Peter 2:22)

2ND SERVICE: BUILDING ON A NEW FOUNDATION (Part 2)

- The Law of Separation and Consecration: We are called to live differently from the world, setting ourselves apart from its standards. Sin is contagious, so we must guard ourselves against worldly influences. (Genesis 24; 2 Corinthians 6:17; Proverbs
- The Law of Testimony and Witness: Sharing our testimonies is a powerful spiritual weapon. stories of victory help us overcome the enemy and encourage others.
- The Law of Discipleship: A disciple imitates their teacher. (Genesis 18:17-19; Luke 5:11). The Bible describes three ways of "walking" with God:

 **Walking after God (Luke 5:11): We become like

Christ by following Him.

Walking before God (Genesis 17): This means

living a life of consecration and holiness. **Walking with God (Genesis 5:24): Staying in a close relationship with Him.

Discipleship is key to maintaining our deliverance. When we are born again, we are set free from curses, but the enemy will try to pull us back. MIDWEEK SERVICE: BUILDING ON A NEW **FOUNDATION (Part 3)**

To remain free, we must commit to discipleship—following Jesus and becoming more like Him.

True deliverance transforms our beliefs, values, and habits. The Israelites, for example, were delivered from Egypt but still struggled with wrong values (Exodus 32).

Principles of Discipleship:

- 1. It starts with a willing heart to follow Jesus (1 Peter
- 2. We must deny ourselves (Matthew 16:24), letting go of selfish ambitions that don't align with God's
- 3. Taking up our cross means surrendering our own desires in favour of God's purpose.
- 4. Following Jesus means imitating Him. Sometimes God places mentors in our lives to guide us—this is the essence of discipleship (1 Corinthians 11:1).

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DAILY DEVOTIONAL

God is the God of restoration. To restore is to bring someone or something back to its original state. Whenever there is a need for restoration, it means that something glorious has been and needs to be brought back to its original state. Because God is the creator and maker of all things and all men, He is the only One who can restore what was lost to its original state.

No other being or man can do this. God restores because He always has an original intention whenever He creates or makes anyone or anything. He longs to restore who and what He made to their original state. He concludes that when He finished the work of creation, His intention was always restoration.

"Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good" (Genesis 1:31). The purpose of divine restoration is to make things very good, not just good.





THE POWER OF PREPARATION (7)

There is nothing of worth that will not cost you something.

The best time to prepare for your tomorrow was last year. The next best time is now. If you start preparing for marriage when you want to get wedded, you are already late.

You don't praying about a life partner or about your marriage the year you want to get married. It should be a prayer project. Something that you pray about months and years ahead before you marry. You should be banking those prayers for your future.

Also add fasting to prayer. If it is possible, pray and fast once a week for marriage. No time is too early neither are you too young. It does not mean that you are ready now to marry or even thinking of relationship, but you are praying ahead of time. Those prayers wait for you in the future.

Just like thoughtful and responsible parents plan the future of their children even before their children come of age, the same way we should treat praying and preparing for marriage. Prayer clears the road ahead of you. It prepares you and the person even if you don't know who. So, take time out every week to fast and pray for your marriage, your unknown spouse and even your children.

If you are parent, take time to pray for the future of your children. Load their clouds with decrees. - "that they will marry well or be married well; that they are far from strangers and devourers". Decree what you desire for them. When you pray like this, marriage will be a blessing. Start praying today!
